WELCOME TO THE EMPLOYER'S GUIDE

This simple guide offers general information on Apprenticeships, how they work and what the benefits are of taking on an Apprentice.

ABOUT APPRENTICESHIPS

Apprenticeships are work-based training programmes allowing young people and adult learners to earn a wage whilst gaining a nationally recognised qualification and learning job specific skills.

THERE ARE THREE LEVELS OF APPRENTICESHIPS

- **Intermediate** - equivalent to 5 GCSE passes
- **Advanced** - equivalent to 2 A level passes
- **Higher** - can lead to NVQ level 4 and above, or a foundation degree

Depending on the sector and job role, an Apprenticeship can take anything between 12 months and 4 years to complete.



Hiring an Apprentice can help your business to grow their own talent by developing a motivated, skilled and qualified workforce.

APPRENTICESHIP FRAMEWORK

An Apprenticeship framework is made up of three main strands:-

- **Competence element** – NVQ/QCF
 - allows an Apprentice to gain a nationally recognised qualification and gain skills needed to do the job
- **Technical element** – Technical Certificate
 - a technical certificate is a knowledge based qualification
- **A skills element** – Functional skills
 - Maths, English or ICT

The three strands are sometimes accompanied by additional qualifications to give the most relevant skills and knowledge required for an Apprentice within the job role.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

A training organisation/college will support an employer to:

- Identify the Apprenticeship that fits your business requirements
- Help to recruit an Apprentice
- Develop a training plan which reflects the Apprentice and employer requirements
- Support the delivery of the training programme, carry out assessments and deliver training



RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE EMPLOYER

- Minimum of 30 hours a week paid employment
- Responsible for paying an Apprentice a wage (at least the national minimum wage for an Apprentice £2.73) increasing to £3.30 from October 2015
- Provide an induction and training
- Provide Apprentices with the same benefits as other employees
- Provide a contract of employment
- Allow time for off-the job training
- An Apprenticeship agreement must be signed between Apprentice and employer
- Support an Apprentice with on-the-job training
- Be involved in reviewing the progress of an Apprentice
- Ensure all Health and Safety regulations are in place – Employer Liability Insurance

AGE GRANT

(APPRENTICESHIP GRANT FOR EMPLOYERS)

You may be eligible for a grant worth up to £1,500 if:

- you are a small to medium sized employer (employing less than 50 employees)
- your Apprentice is aged 16-24
- you have not employed an Apprentice in the last 12 months

The Apprenticeship Grant has been developed to support business growth by offering young people employment through Apprenticeships.

TRAINEESHIPS

What is a Traineeship?

Traineeships prepare young people for their future careers by helping them to become ‘work ready’.

They provide essential work preparation training, English and Maths skills and work experience they require to get an Apprenticeship or to progress to further learning.

Employers are not required to pay the young person but may support learners with expenses such as transport and meals.

Traineeships are very flexible and tailored to the needs of the employer and the individual.
